## Intergenerational Wellbeing for Aotearoa

Future generations deserve to inherit a world that enables them to thrive. At The Tindall Foundation, we support innovative initiatives that create long-term, positive impact for people and the planet. ### Parents and caregivers are empowered and supported to provide the best start in life for their babies and young children

- Enhancing **wellbeing for women and birthing parents**, and nurturing strong parent-child bonds in the early years of children's lives
- Supporting whānau with tailored early interventions that **promote emotional regulation**, build resilience, and prevent pathways into the justice system
- **Empowering children in foster care** to advocate for their wellbeing and influence the care system

### Equitable and affordable access to life's essential needs such as safe, secure housing/shelter, nourishing food and reliable energy

- Partnership with the **community housing** sector on affordable housing
- Systems change and community-led initiatives that strengthen **food security, food sovereignty, and access to clean drinking water**
- **Community-led housing repairs** focused on improving living conditions and health outcomes
- **Community-driven energy systems** in rural and underserved areas and support services for affordable energy
- Mechanisms for households to **avoid high-cost intergenerational debt**



### People know who they are and where they come from, feel safe in their identity and experience a strong sense of belonging & Socially cohesive communities where people are connected, trust one another, and their contribution is valued

- **Supporting trans, takatāpui and intersex people** to feel safe, connected, visible and a strong sense of belonging - with access to resources and services that uphold their rights and wellbeing
- Amplifying the leadership, influence, visibility, and **representation of Māori and Pasifika**
- **Protecting and revitalising Māori and Pasifika, culture** and traditional practices, to strengthen identity and representation
- **Strengthening social cohesion** in communities by fostering inclusion, trust and shared purpose

### Communities are resourced and self-sufficient, driving local solutions and long-term wellbeing

- Building **capacity, capability and leadership** for intergenerational wellbeing in communities
- Empowering communities with resources to enable **locally led solutions**
- Supporting **place-based innovation and enterprise** to grow, flourish and strengthen whānau resilience
